

Transforming Care Partnership

Clinical Commissioning Groups and local authorities from Calderdale, Kirklees, Wakefield and Barnsley (CKWB) have come together as a Transforming Care Partnership (TCP).

The Partnership has developed a plan and a review process and is working together to improve services for individuals with learning disabilities, autism or both. They have also developed local children and young people Care, Education and Treatment Reviews panels, established a 'Children's LD/ASD risk management and family support register' and published information for parent carers and anyone who may be involved in the CETR process.

The plan focuses on developing quality community services with crisis response teams improve the quality of support people get and to try to prevent them being admitted into hospital.

- Care, Education and Treatment Reviews (CETRs) for children and young people

4. Care and Treatment Reviews: Better Care Now
5. Care and Treatment Reviews: Visiting Hospitals
