

## THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF CALDERDALE (WAINSTALLS SCHOOL) (WAINSTALLS ROAD AND TREE LANE) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2023

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the Borough Council of Calderdale ('the Council') under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act') made the above experimental Order on 25 October 2023 the general effect of which is to introduce the following restrictions:

- (a) one way system at all times on Tree Lane, Halifax proceeding in a westerly direction from a point approximately 55 metres south west of its junction with Cold Edge Road in a westerly direction to a point approximately 18 metres east of its junction with Wainstalls Road;
- (b) no vehicles shall wait, load or unload during 8.15am to 9.15am and 2.30pm to 4.00pm Mondays to Fridays in the following lengths of Wainstalls Road -
  - 1) on its east side from a point 16 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of Tree Lane in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 49 metres;
  - 2) on its east side from a point approximately 90 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of Tree Lane in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 35 metres;
  - 3) on its east side from a point approximately 138 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of Tree Lane in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 13 metres;
- (c) no vehicle shall wait or stop 8.00am 5.00pm Mondays to Fridays on the School Keep Clear Markings on the east side of Wainstalls Road from a point approximately 65 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of Tree Lane in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 25 metres.

The Order comes into force on 6 November 2023 for a period not exceeding 18 months. Copies of the experimental order together with a map showing the affected roads and the Statement of Reasons for its making are available for inspection at Halifax Central Library, Halifax, HX1 1QG, from 10.00am to 5.30pm on Mondays to Fridays and 10.00am to 4.00pm on Saturdays. The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person wishing to object to such indefinite continuation of the provisions may do so in writing within a period of six months from 6 November 2023 (i.e. by 6 May 2024), or if the Order is varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Act, within six months from the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force. All objections must specify the grounds on which they are made and be sent to either proposedtro@calderdale.gov.uk or to Highways and Transportation, C/O the Town Hall. Crossley Street, Halifax, HX1 1UJ for the attention of the Highways Traffic Team.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the experimental Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirements of the Act or of any instrument made under it have not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made (i.e. from 25 October 2023), apply to the High Court for that purpose.
